



7:20pm Frank Hogans

Opening the contest this evening is Frank Hogans. Frank was raised on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, along the creeks and rivers of the Chesapeake, in a small fishing and farming town only 15 miles by water from Baltimore, but a world away by land. He picked up the guitar at age 13 and has never stopped. Self-taught, he developed a unique and delicate finger-picking style that is complimented by his mastery of numerous alternate guitar tunings.

His award-winning songwriting is best described as intensely visual and ultimately personal. With irreverence to perceived convention and to all things predictable, he surprises and satisfies listeners with music and lyrics that refuse to fit any mold. Frank still resides on the Eastern Shore, but plays many venues in the Maryland, DC, and Delaware region.

7:40pm Bert Delpierre

Joining us from Marylands western shore, Bert is no stranger to the Peninsula and has spent many hours pickin' around the campfire on the Eastern Shore. His most recent collaboration, "Scenic View" can be found giggin' in the Washington D.C. Area.

Bringing covers and original songs that often tell of positivity, life and "keeping it real", his influences come from many genres, including folk, jam bands and good old classic rock and roll. Bert's positive upbeat personality shines on stage and he's sure to leave you smiling.

With around 20 years of writing and performing under his belt, Webb's vivid storytelling combined with a powerful stage presence both solo and with his band Howl Train, sets him apart as a standout artist.

2:00 Bryan & The Barn Owls

Born in Lewes, in 1991, Bryan Scar inherited a love for music at an early age. His first guitar was a flamenco guitar handed down from his uncle. Moving in and out of various bands through high school/college, Bryan developed a unique songwriting style composed



of many influences, including John Denver, Billy Joel, and Jim Croce. During this time, he gained experience as a composer, and mastered the song process. Returning to Delaware in 2021, after studying music in Los Angeles he began his solo artist journey. He draws inspiration from Americas countryside, his personal journey, and events in history. Since 2013 he's released four solo albums, played numerous times on radio and TV, and won Best Local Artist in 2021. He performs in Delaware all the way to Tennessee. Today Bryan is appearing with his trio, Bryan and The Barn Owls.

Fiddler John Heinz was born in New Jersey. His parents were opera stars Jerome Heinz and Lucia Evangelista. John grew up listening to opera but was eventually swayed by country music that he mixed with many other genres. He moved to the Eastern Shore in early 2000 and has played in numerous bands, opening for Trace Atkins, Little Big Town, Doyle Lawson and Quick Silver. John also did a stint in Nashville. He's currently a NASA technician and still finds a place to love music.

Phinex Diego, on bass, is one of the original members of Bryan & The Barn Owls which started back in 2018. Music has been a part of him for his whole life, particularly the bass. Phinex met Bryan through their vocal coach back in 2017. Bryan needed a stand-up bass player to complete his vision of an Americana trio and Phinex fit the bill. They've shared numerous stages since 2018 and musically, they continue to grow.


3:00pm SKRIBE

Inspired by everyday life and current events, he delivers creative homespun melodies that are both contemporary and timeless. When hes not playing music or writing new songs, he works as a graphic artist, pouring imaginative texture and design into print much in the same way he creates his music.

3:00 Workshop with the Hoola Guru



Latif, The Hoola Guru, inspires and encourages positivity through movement, fun and laughter! This interactive workshop focuses on physical and emotional well being while having a good time. Meet us over near the basketball courts for this all ages, feel good, hoopin' and movin' dance party!

4:00 Workshop with Shafaat Khan



An inter-disciplinary workshop which Rhythm explores the culture, history, and tradit of Indian classical music and its art of explores the culture, history, and tradition improvisation. Attendees will be introduced to basic technique for playing traditional musical instruments such as Tabla (a set of improvisation. Attendees will be introduced two drums).

This session will help develop an appreciation of unique traditions in world music through classical Indian music and its art of improvisation. Mr. Khan will also demonstrate basic techniques for tabla, using the language of the tabla to communicate about rhythm.



5:00pm Joe Biaone Trio



The relative rarity of vibraphonists in the history of jazz remains one of the musical genre's true mysteries. Despite the natural beauty of the instrument's sound and the historical importance and celebrated popularity of its most famous players; Lionel Hampton, Milt Jackson, and Bobby Hutcherson: comparatively few artists have chosen to make the vibraphone their primary means of expression. Fortunately, Joe Baione shows that the vibes and the mallets with which he plays them are in very good hands.

Delaware native, Joe grew up in a jazz drenched musical environment. His father, the clarinetist-saxophonist-educator Jim Baione, is a graduate of Philadelphia's Combs Conservatory of Music, where he first met Joe's musician mother, Barbara. Other musical members of the Baione family include Joe's two older brothers, bassist Tom and guitarist Jimmy. Following in his father's footsteps, Joe studied both music education and jazz performance, graduating from UMES 1995. He has since gone on to become a passionate and creative band teacher by day and an energetic and innovative band leader and performer at night. Joe is the Assistant Stage Manager for the Delaware State Fair for headline concerts

Joe Baione has performed at many prestigious festivals and venues including the Trinidad Jazz and Steelpan Festival, Jamaica Jazz and Blues Festival, Dizzy's Club Coca-Cola, The Kimmel Center, The Freeman Stage, and the Rehoboth Autumn Jazz Festival. Joe also loves to give back to the community and does local outdoor concert series to preserve and support live music. Joining Joe today are Dan Kostelnik on organ and drummer Webb Thomas. Joe last played the Delmarva Folk Festival in 2012.

6:00pm Wicked Sycamore



Hailing from the Baltimore/DC area, Wicked Sycamore is an all-female trio consisting of Juliette Bell on guitar, Lainie Gray on mandolin, and Madeline Waters on cello. Their sound can be described as contemporary folk with a mischievous edge that is grounded in traditional roots, Americana, and bluegrass. They write original music ranging from fun, light-hearted sing-alongs to deep, introspective tunes for the ages. No matter the genre, their music relies heavily on intricate vocal harmonies, thoughtful arrangement, and instrumental prowess. By growing their presence as a collaborative force, they hope to increase female representation as musicians and songwriters throughout the modern music landscape.

The women of Wicked Sycamore began playing music together in 2015 and they soon discovered a shared desire to explore acoustic interests in a more intimate ensemble. As a trio, their music is driven largely by blending the familiar and traditional with the daring and unexpected. Each member is a multi-instrumentalist who brings a unique background and influence to their sound, highlighting their collective musicality and progressive songwriting.

7:00pm Shafatt Khan

World-renowned classical Indian musician, Shafaat Khan, debuted at age 11 in the King's Lynn Festival opened by the Queen Mother. Since then he's performed worldwide at many prestigious concert halls, festivals, and universities in India, Pakistan, Japan, Russia, China, Malaysia, UK, Germany, France, Italy, and other European countries. He's played events that were inaugurated by numerous dignitaries, including Presidents and Primes Ministers of various countries around the world.



He's shared the stage and appeared on television with Ray Charles in Germany and with Stevie Wonder during the Bonaroo Festival.

Through his music, he has helped to raise money for various charitable causes including concerts for world peace, disabled children, and tsunami victims, helping to serve those in need.

Mr. Khan's musical heritage can be traced back to the 16th century to the court of the Mughal Emperor Akbar. He is the son of the legendary Sitar and Surbahar Maestro Ustad Imrat Khan and nephew of the legendary Ustad Vilayat Khan. In tabla, he is the foremost disciple of the widely respected Ustad Ibrahim.
